SETUP OF THE LECTURE SERIES

Following the successful International Order and Justice Lecture Series in previous years, the Ghent Law Faculty is organizing a fourth series of guest lectures by seven undisputed 'heavyweights' in the broader international legal domain in 2022-23.

Seven experts will each deliver a public lecture on topics ranging from the protection of foreign investment in times of armed conflict, international law in the cyber domain, the protection of the marine environment, or the significance of international law for the EU's trade and foreign policy. Particular attention is paid to the interaction between law and politics, and the evolution of international law's place in the international community.

The lecture series is organized under the auspices of the Ghent Rolin-Jaequemyns International Law Institute (GRILI), in partnership with the Vrije Universiteit Brussel. It is made possible through the financial support of the Doctoral School of Arts, Humanities and Law at Ghent University. It is coordinated by Prof. dr. Tom Ruys, Prof. Dr. Luca Ferro and Drs. Frederik Rogiers.
