





Following the successful International Order and Justice Lecture Series in 2015-16 and 2017-18, the Ghent Law Faculty will in the upcoming academic year (2020-21) organize another series of guest lectures by eight undisputed 'heavyweights' in the broader international legal domain.

Eight experts will each deliver a public lecture on topics ranging from the peaceful settlement of disputes, and the protection of the environment during armed conflicts, to the interplay between international and European law.

The lecture series is organized under the auspices of the Ghent Rolin-Jaequemyns International Law Institute (GRILI), in partnership with the Vrije Universiteit Brussel. It is made possible through the financial support of the Doctoral School of Arts. Humanities and Law at Ghent University and the Belgian Society of International Law. It is coordinated by Prof. dr. Tom Ruys. Prof. dr. Frederik Dhondt and Dr. Luca Ferro.
