





SETUP OF THE SPECIALIST COURSE

Following the successful International Order and Justice Lecture Series in 2015-16 and 2017-18, the Ghent Law Faculty will in the upcoming academic year (2020-21) organize another series of guest lectures by, and concomitant closed sessions for doctoral and post-doctoral researchers with, eight undisputed 'heavyweights' in the broader international legal domain.

Eight experts will each deliver a public lecture on topics ranging from the peaceful settlement of disputes, and the protection of the environment during armed conflicts, to the interplay between international and European law.

The external speakers will moreover participate in closed interactive sessions during which one or more doctoral researchers will give a presentation relating to their research, and receive first-hand feedback from an established legal scholar in their domain. Other doctoral researchers will be able to engage in the ensuing debate. For the first time, the lecture series will also feature a 6-hour 'crash course' on international legal theory by a leading expert on the topic.

The lecture series is organized under the auspices of the Ghent Rolin-Jaequemyns International Law Institute (GRILI), in partnership with the Vrije Universiteit Brussel. It is made possible through the financial support of the Doctoral School of Arts, Humanities and Law at Ghent University and the Belgian Society of International Law. It is coordinated by Prof. dr. Tom Ruys, Prof. dr. Frederik Dhondt and Dr. Luca Ferro.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Participation in the Specialist Course is open to all doctoral students, whether from Ghent University or external institutions. Other persons wishing to participate in the interactive sessions should inquire with the organizers. Reading materials will be distributed to enrolled candidates, prior to the lectures. Those who enrol and participate in all lectures can obtain an ECTS certificate from the Ghent University Doctoral Schools administration.

Doctoral students wishing to present during one of the interactive sessions are invited to submit a short proposal (abstract no more than 300 words) to the organizers (Tom.Ruys@UGent.be) and specify the session during which they would like to do so. Presentations need not overlap with the topic of the parallel public lectures, but should generally relate to the broader expertise of the external quests.

Registration is possible for separate sessions or for the entire lecture series. The registration fee for the full lecture series is € 100; a single session (public lecture + corresponding interactive session) comes at € 25. A reduced registration fee of € 50 and € 15 resp. applies for doctoral students enrolled at the partner institutions (UA, VUB, ULC, UCL). Participation in the Specialist Course will be free of charge for doctoral researchers and students of Ghent University, as well as members of The Belgian Society of International Law.
